UoM approaches in the development and application of practices in the field of climate change and sustainability

PROACTIVE APPROACH

Implementation of the University's basic activities, scientific research activities and education in order to raise awareness of climate change and sustainability and develop research and innovative activities in these areas

PASSIVE APPROACH

Implementation of activities and measures that will directly reduce the impact of the University on all aspects of the environment and increase sustainability

- 1. <u>Non-academic services</u>
- 2. <u>Management practices</u>







PASSIVE APPROACH

- Non-academic services Promote sustainability in their own operations and practices. UoM has been working on:
 - Adaptation to the needs of individuals with disabilities
 - Reconstruction of existing infrastructure with energy efficiency improvements, and construction of new facilities
- 2. <u>Management practices</u> integrate sustainability into their strategic planning and decision-making processes. Even though UoM has not yet committed itself to strategic planning in this field, the University now:
 - increases diversity and inclusion,
 - promotes fair labor practices,
 - enhances social responsibility.












PROACTIVE APPROACH

 - Master (3) (Inclusive Education; Energy Efficiency, Renewable Energy Sources and Environmental Impacts; Energy Efficiency)








