

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The Ss. Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje is the first state University in the Republic of Macedonia, **founded in 1949**, initially with three faculties:

- Faculty of Philosophy,
- Faculty of Medicine,
- Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry.

At the moment, the University represents a functional community of:

- 24 faculties,
- 5 research institutes,
- 11 accompanying members.








The Ss. Cyril and Methodius University develops study programs in all scientific fields:

- natural sciences and mathematics,
- technical and technological sciences,
- medical sciences and health,
- biotechnical sciences,
- social sciences,
- humanities and arts.









Nowadays, the illustration of UKIM through figures is as follows:

- around 50.000 enrolled students from Republic of Macedonia;
- over 700 foreign students;
- over 2.700 teaching, research and associate academic staff;
- over 126.000 graduated high-professional staff (Bachelor degree);
- over 5,300 candidates obtained Master's of science degree;
- around 3,200 doctors of science.

The research work is carried out at the faculties, but also at the research institutes as an integral part of the University.


Faculty of Civil Engineering

Knowledge FOr Resilient soCiEty / K-FORCE ERASMUS + K2 project



The aim of the project was to improve regional resilience to hazards and capability for regional cooperation in risk prevention and response and to ensure national professional resources and regional capacities in order to build regional-based disaster preparedness and a culture of safety and resilience at all levels according to EU Integration Strategies and National relevant strategies.

Four curricula were modernized or developed and implemented at WBC partner HEIs:

- Disaster Risk Management and Fire Safety Engineering academic master/module programme
- Disaster Risk Management and Fire Safety Engineering academic doctoral programme;
- Protection Engineering vocational master programme
- Economic and Financial Resilience vocational master module

ROCK Project Regeneration and Optimisation of Cultural Heritage in Creative and Knowledge Cities

ROCK is a **Horizon 2020** funded project.



ROCK develops an **innovative**, **collaborative** and **circular systemic approach** for **regeneration and adaptive reuse of historic city centres**. Implementing a repertoire of successful heritage-led regeneration initiatives, ROCK test the replicability of the spatial approach and of successful models addressing the specific needs of historic city centres.

ROCK focuses on historic city centres as extraordinary laboratories to demonstrate how Cultural Heritage [CH] can be a unique and powerful engine of regeneration, sustainable development and economic growth for the whole city.





EUCANET Project - European Urban Agencies Network



EUCANET is the European Agencies Network for citizenship, inclusion, involvement and empowerment of communities through the urban transformation process.

EUCANET is co-funded by the Europe for Citizens Programme of the European Union.

The focus of the EUCANET project is in following areas: implementation of EU Urban Agenda, policies of urban development with high level of social inclusion in a transformation troubled cities, new approaches and tools for urban planning with enhanced citizens' participation and sustainability, new models of urban planning, digital tools for visualization and evaluation of the urban changes.

SINERGI – Social Integration through Urban Growth Strategies

The SINERGI project is focused on establishing a network of cooperation between city administration, experts, civic organizations and will work on promoting and exercising EU knowledge and experience in citizen's participation in the field of urban planning and development with promotion of good practices from partner cities Skopje, Turin, Lisbon and Zagreb.

The aim of the project is organization of activities that would create a platform for exchange of knowledge that should brought together in a creative and open debate and communication between local authorities, Universities and research community, civil organizations and civil activist and citizens.

This platform should enable use of novel and digital tools for better analysis and understanding the processes that are shaping our cities but most of all should enable different social and interest groups to take an active participation and exchange of knowledge with experts, researchers and activist in a joint effort to create strategies, projects and communication tools that will reinforce the process of city management.





SMACH - Sustainable Management of Cultural Heritage in the Balkans in response to Climate Change for Adaptation and Intercultural Cooperation.

SMACH Project is co-funded by the Central European Initiative - CEI, and aims at promoting know-how exchange between EU and the Balkan Region on this topic.

SMACH is a project in response to climate change. The project got together 10 institutions from 6 countries with one common goal - building capacity on sustainable management of cultural heritage based on needs assessment and good practices identification.

The project engaged key stakeholders in the fields of cultural heritage and climate change.

Projects like SMACH aim at building a European – Balkan community for the sustainable management of cultural heritage in response to climate change to preserve our heritage, our past and our future.
