- Answers that were not clear, were excluded from the analysis






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Type of institutions (12 responses)




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Obligation and control of the implementation of practices (12 responses)




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Areas to which the measurements are directed (12 responses)




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Reasons for the implementation of these measurements (12 responses)




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The impact of these practices on the institution (11 responses)




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The barriers to implementing environmentally sustainable practices (11 responses)

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Wrap up:

- All of the interviewed institutions follow some of the activities related to environmentally sustainable practices
- The majority of them implement selective waste collection
- The majority of interviewed institutions are institutions of education (41,7%)
- The most common reason for the implementation of these measurements is raising awareness about environmental protection (58,3%)
- The biggest impact of these practices on the institutions is the creation of a more pleasant work environment (45,5%)
- The biggest barrier to implementing environmentally sustainable practices is lack of financial resources (36,4%)
- The biggest motive for implementing practices is giving a personal example to contribute to the protection of the environment (83,3%)
